## 3 Matters arising –

- Becoming a Charter Branch JC reported that the Tree Charter has been drawn up after consultation with 80 groups, whittled down to 13 principals including the WT. At the time of the meeting JC had not been able to speak to Sarah Shorley about the ramifications of becoming a Charter Branch, but had left her contact details and will report back when she hears anything.

# 4 Roundhouse

After much discussion it was agreed that we do want one, but not yet and without more research. Either way it was agreed that, whilst we recognise the need for capital expenditure (as otherwise asking local people to continue to fundraise is becoming unjustifiable) the reported cost of  $\pounds 10,000 - \pounds 12,000$  was far too high. It was thought that, using our own resourcefulness, we should be able to achieve a creditable result for a much lower investment. MC made the point that it is still very early days for such a requirement and JC was concerned that we not make things too comfortable for local drug dealers.

#### 5 Mower attachment

The growing problem of blackthorn encroachment was discussed and the immediate solution proposed that MC should investigate an attachment for the bigger tractor to cope with both horizontal and vertical cutting (thought to cost about £1500)

# 6 Beehive

Margy is talking to the WT about agreeing to the erection of a beehive for wild bees in the wood. The committee agreed to fund two, subject to WT agreement, as above.
